RULES OF THE VIRTUAL FAIR

The following guidelines apply to all categories of exhibits, EXCEPT the Junior Section and the Family Fun Section. Please see those sections for specific guidelines.

1. There is no fee to participate in our virtual fair. It is open to any resident of Ontario. If you have a membership number from previous years, please use the same number. If you need a membership number, they can be obtained from the Secretary/Treasurer by emailing providencebayfair@gmail.com or calling 705-377-5003.
2. Entries must be submitted through the fair website before 11:59 pm on Saturday, August 8.
3. Entries are to be submitted as an image. Entries will be judged solely on the image submitted.
4. If you require assistance with taking or uploading photos, please email providencebayfair@gmail.com or call 705-377- 5003 and we will be happy to assist you.
5. The exhibit judging will take place between August 9 and August 21. Results will be announced on Friday, August 21 by noon through the fair website and social media pages.
6. Only one (1) entry is allowed per membership in each individual section and the same article/exhibit cannot be entered in more than one section.
7. Any exhibits entered in the 2020 Virtual Fair are still eligible to be entered in the 2021 Fair.
8. Monetary prizes are not being awarded this year, however, a prize will be awarded to the individual with the highest number of points in each category, as well as to the individual with the highest number of points overall. Points will be calculated as follows: 1st place - 5 pts; 2nd place - 4 pts; 3rd place - 3 pts; all other entries - 1 pt

RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Animals should be clean and/or groomed.
2. For showmanship sections (1-4), the exhibitor should be in the photo.

RULES & REGULATIONS

1. All entries must be grown on land occupied by the exhibitor.
2. Use a white/neutral background when taking photos, if possible.

Section:

1. Neatest Sheaf of Grain
2. Best Matched Cucumbers (3)
3. Three Large Red Tomatoes
4. Oddity of Nature
5. Herb Collection (at least 4 varieties in an attractive setting, herbs must be fresh, not dried)
6. Fruit and/or Vegetable Collection Artistically Displayed
7. Neatest Vegetable Garden

FLOWERS

RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Flowers are to be shown with their own foliage and no artificial colouring.
2. A bloom is an individual flower, one on a stem. A bud showing colour is counted as a bloom.
3. A stem or stalk may have more than one flower or bud.
4. A spike is an upright stem with several flowers.
5. Use a white/neutral background when taking photos, if possible.

1. Potted Plant, Any Type
2. Gladioli, One Spike
3. Hydrangea, One Stem
4. Outdoor Container, containing Three Varieties
5. Three Blooms, Annuals, All the Same
6. Arrangement that includes Sunflowers
7. Best Flower Bed

RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Amateur photographers only.
2. Exhibitor must have taken all photos.
3. All photos must be in colour.

RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Exhibits to be the work of the exhibitor.
2. Needlecraft must be clean.
3. Any items that are a pair must be identical.
4. Items must appear new.
5. Embroidery and sewing must be pressed.
6. Use a white/neutral background when taking photos, if possible.

Sections:

1. Knitted Baby Sweater & Hat Set
2. Pair of Knitted Mitts
3. Crocheted Centrepiece or Doily
4. Apron (Sewn)
5. Embroidered Quilt Block
6. Toddler's Homemade Toy – Any Kind

QUILTING

RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Entries must be the work of the exhibitor.
2. Any items that are a pair must be identical.
3. For sections 1-3 and 7-9, include a ruler or tape measure in the image on one side of the quilt.

Machine Quilted Sections:

1. Lap Quilt (between 180" and 240" perimeter)
2. Miniature Quilt (maximum 96" perimeter, replica of large quilt)
3. Crib Quilt
4. Wall Hanging (depicting a holiday or season)
5. Table Runner or Topper
6. Pair of Place Mats (not pre-quilted fabric)

Hand Quilted Sections

7. Lap Quilt (between 180" and 240" perimeter)
8. Miniature Quilt (maximum 96" perimeter, replica of large quilt)
9. Crib Quilt
10. Wall Hanging (depicting a holiday or season)
11. Table Runner or Topper
12. Pair of Place Mats (not pre-quilted fabric)

The challenge is to have enough quilt blocks to make a quilt to be donated to the Hospital Auxiliary.

Rules for the Quilt Block Challenge:

1. Block must measure 12.5" x 12.5" unfinished. Please include a ruler or tape measure in the image.
2. Use cream or off-white for background.
3. You may add as many colours as you wish.
4. You may hand or machine piece, hand or machine appliqué.

RULES & REGULATIONS

1. A junior exhibitor number can be obtained by emailing almjohnston@gmail.com with the following information: Exhibitor Name, Exhibitor Age (as of July 31, 2020), Parent Name, Parent Email, Mailing Address, Phone Number.
2. Please show the age of exhibitor **in the image** in **ALL CATEGORIES**, or entry will be disqualified. Show the age only, no names or other identifying information. Some ways to do this - write the age on the exhibit, include a small piece of paper with the age in the image, or add the text on to the image before submitting.
3. All entries must be handmade, and not computer generated.
4. Roots, vegetables and flowers must be home grown.
5. Use a white/neutral background when taking photos, if possible.
6. Parents are urged to allow the children to do the work and preparation of exhibits without assistance. Please encourage them in every way, but remember that every bit of work you do for them helps defeat the objective of the Junior Section of the fair.

1st - \$3.00, 2nd - \$2.50, 3rd - \$2.00, 4th - \$1.50

6 YEARS AND UNDER

1. Colour the provided picture (available to download [here](#))
2. Draw a picture and title it "Life on the Farm" (hand printed, paper no larger than 8.5" x 11")
3. Egg Carton Boat (other craft supplies may also be used)
4. Create a paper collage depicting something in nature (no larger than 8.5" x 11", any type of paper may be used in the collage)
5. Create a structure using only toothpicks and marshmallows.
6. Cupcake Decorated to look like a Farm Animal. (Decorations must be edible. Decoration only to be judged).

7-10 YEARS

7. Colour the provided picture (available to download [here](#))
8. Print by hand and decorate an acrostic poem for "FARM LIFE" (no larger than 8.5" x 11")
9. Egg Carton Boat (other craft materials may also be used)
10. Create a structure using only toothpicks and marshmallows.
11. Cupcake Decorated to look like a Farm Animal. (Decorations must be edible. Decoration only to be judged).
12. Take a unique photo of an historical building on Manitoulin.

11-15 YEARS

13. Colour the provided picture (available to download [here](#))
14. Cursive writing, on 3-ring lined paper, written on every other line, a poem of your choice (minimum of 10 lines, maximum of 16 lines, include title and author)
15. Artist Trading Cards - 2.5" x 3.5", any medium, set of 3, one sided only
16. Take a unique photo of an historical building on Manitoulin.
17. Woodwork Item
18. Homemade Cookie Gift – Minimum of 4 cookies, presented in a 6" or smaller decorated gift box. Only appearance and presentation to be judged.

OPEN TO ALL JUNIORS

19. Three Cucumbers (between 4" and 10" long) - include a ruler in the image
20. Three Garden Carrots (4-6" long, stems attached) - include a ruler in the image
21. A collection of farm crops (minimum of 4 varieties), mounted and labeled
22. Hairy Soup Can Creature - grow grass, clover or herbs in a small soup can, decorate the can to look like a hairy creature
23. "Rainy Days" - wildflower arrangement in a rubber boot
24. Three Rice Krispie Treats, any shape(s) - be creative!

JUNIOR FAIR AMBASSADORS

One exhibitor from each age category will be awarded the title of JUNIOR FAIR AMBASSADOR. This will be the exhibitor with the highest number of points from the exhibits in their age category, as well as the "Open" category. Points will be awarded as follows:

1st place - 5 pts; 2nd place - 4 pts; 3rd place - 3 pts; 4th place - 2 pts; all other entries - 1 pt

Each ambassador will receive an additional \$10 prize, plus a full weekend wristband pass to the 2021 fair.

SPECIAL: YOUTH POSTER COMPETITION

Theme: "Promoting Your Fair"

- Name and date of the fair must be clearly shown on the poster

- Age Categories:
- a) Junior – up to and including Grade 4
 - b) Intermediate – Grades 5-8
 - c) Senior – Grades 9-12

Rules & Regulations:

- 1. Poster must be hand drawn.
- 2. Poster size: Minimum 22 cm x 28 cm to a maximum of 28 cm x 44 cm, without border. Please include a ruler in the photo.
- 3. Each entry must be centred on cardstock or bristol board to give a 5.5 cm border on all sides.
- 4. Each exhibitor is limited to one entry.

Prize Money: 1st - \$10.00, 2nd - \$5.00

The winning poster from each age category will be eligible to enter the District competition.

FAMILY FUN TROPHY

RULES & REGULATIONS

- 1. Only those families entered in the Family Fun Trophy Competition may enter items in this class.
- 2. Only one entry per section per family.
- 3. All entries must be handmade, and not computer generated, unless specified.
- 4. Roots, vegetables and flowers must be home grown.
- 5. Where possible, families are encouraged to work together to complete items.

Sections:

- 1. Display of garden produce from family gardens (minimum of 5 different items)
- 2. A family tree - any medium, should include, at minimum, all members competing in the family fun competition
- 3. A family crest - unique design, any medium
- 4. A family project or event - photo display, include written descriptions

Points for each section will also be awarded toward the Family Fun Trophy:
1st: 5 pts, 2nd: 4 pts, 3rd: 3 pts, all other entries: 1 pt

The family with the most points overall will be awarded an additional 5 pts.
